It wasn't just the economy (thankfully!)

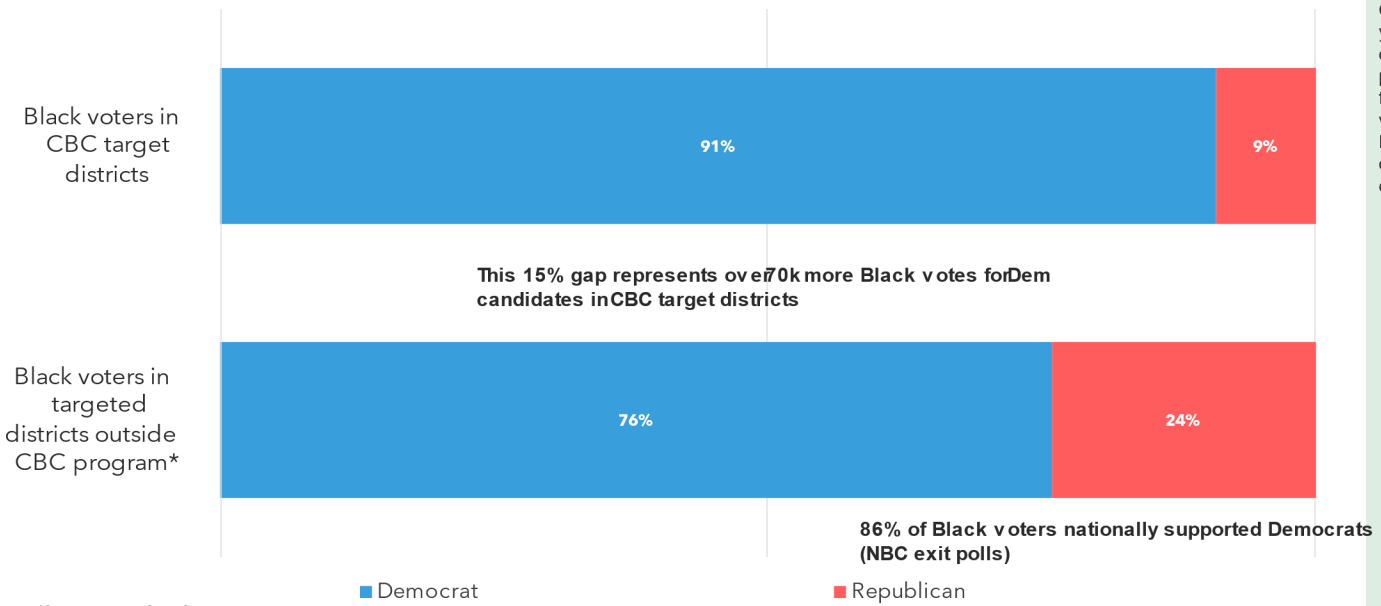
Key issue and value cross-pressures allowed Dems to erode the *red wave*

In our CBC IE districts, our targets well out-performed their national average

A survey of 802 voters in battleground districts and 200 oversample of Black voters

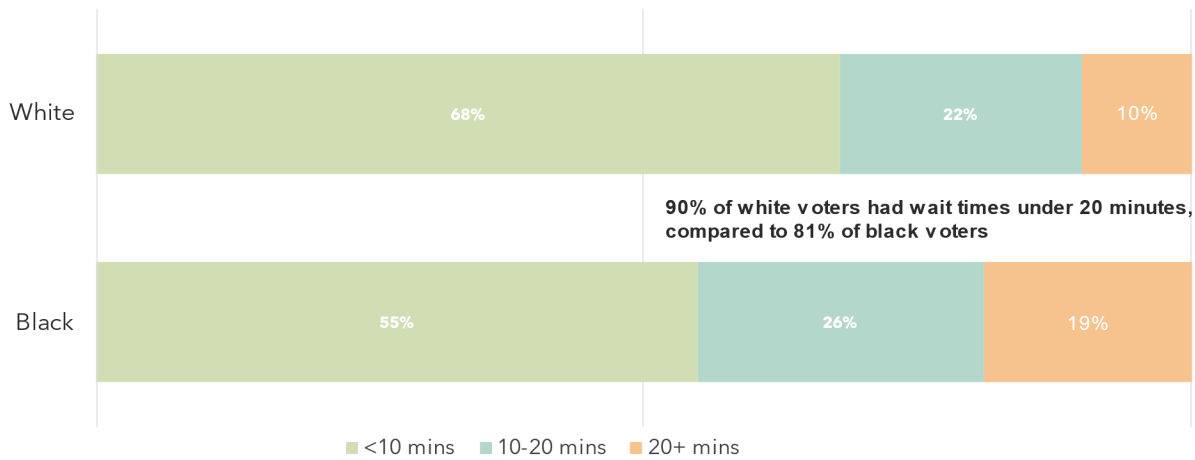
Key Finding Democrat performance was markedly better among Black voters in districts with CBC IE programming targeting them. We met these voters where they were on issues effectively, and drew a compelling narrative for why they should support the Democratic candidate and reject the Republican

Wait times significantly longer for Black voters

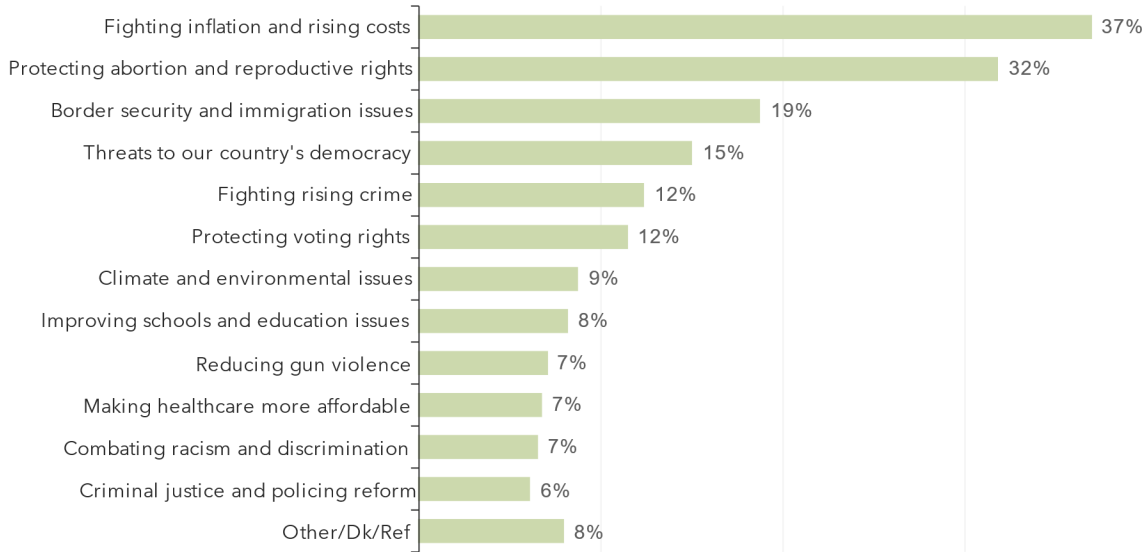

Voters were greatly cross pressured by a multitude of issues it wasn't simply inflation; but abortion, voting rights, democracy, and border security also played key roles in how voters decided

Q24. And generally speaking, please tell me which issues were the most important to you in deciding which candidate to vote for in the recent election for Congress?

GOP ran up score around inflation/crime/immigration, but around basically every other issue voters broke solidly for Dems, and we ran up a larger margin on the issue of abortion than they did on inflation- helping to push back red wave.
